Collage and drawing


In Afternoon Art Club, we get children making art.

Give your catalogues a new life in this fun activity everyone can try at home.
You will need:

- Catalogues or newspaper
- Paper
- Drawing materials
- Scissors
- Glue stick







Part 1- Collage

- 1. Peruse your catalogues and newspapers for an image that has been cropped. The best ones for this activity are the photos where things are missing like bodies limbs and heads!
- 2. Cut out your chosen image with scissors. Cut as close to the image as you can. Ask an adult to help if you need it.
- 3. Paste your image in the middle of your piece of paper.

Part 2- drawing

- 1. Use a pencil to draw the missing parts around the cropped image. You can be realistic or as imaginative as you want here. For example you could choose to draw a horse body onto the horse head OR use your imagination to create a new crazy animal!
- 2. Use markers, textas and/or coloured pencils to add colour.

TIP: when using coloured pencil, leave some areas light and build layers in other areas to create different tones for a 3D effect.







Hmm... A frog horse sitting on the sun enjoying a sweet treat with its foal kitten... Is your picture just as nuts?!:D

Extension activities

- 1. Repeat the activity over and over with different images. Try using more than one image in a work for something more challenging.
- 2. Set up a device overhead and take a timelapse video of the process.
- 3. Write a short story based on your creation. Create an audio recording of a reading.
